Citing your Sources

Family History is not about finding records to attach to your family tree.

It is about determining kinship between people and understanding their identify, telling their story.

It is about what you do with the records after you find them.

What to do when you get a record?

- 1. Examine the actual record if you can
 - a. What was the purpose of this record?
 - b. Who supplied the information?
 - c. Write down what you've learned
- 2. Write a citation for the record
 - a. Need to be able to find it again
 - b. Need to be able to evaluate the validity of the information

Which one is right?

When was Jeremiah Gillespie born?

None of the evidence has an identified informant.

None appears to have been recorded at the time of Jeremiah's birth.

The bible was most likely transcribed by someone who had some knowledge directly or indirectly of Jeremiah's birth date.

Until other evidence is found, the family bible is the best source.
